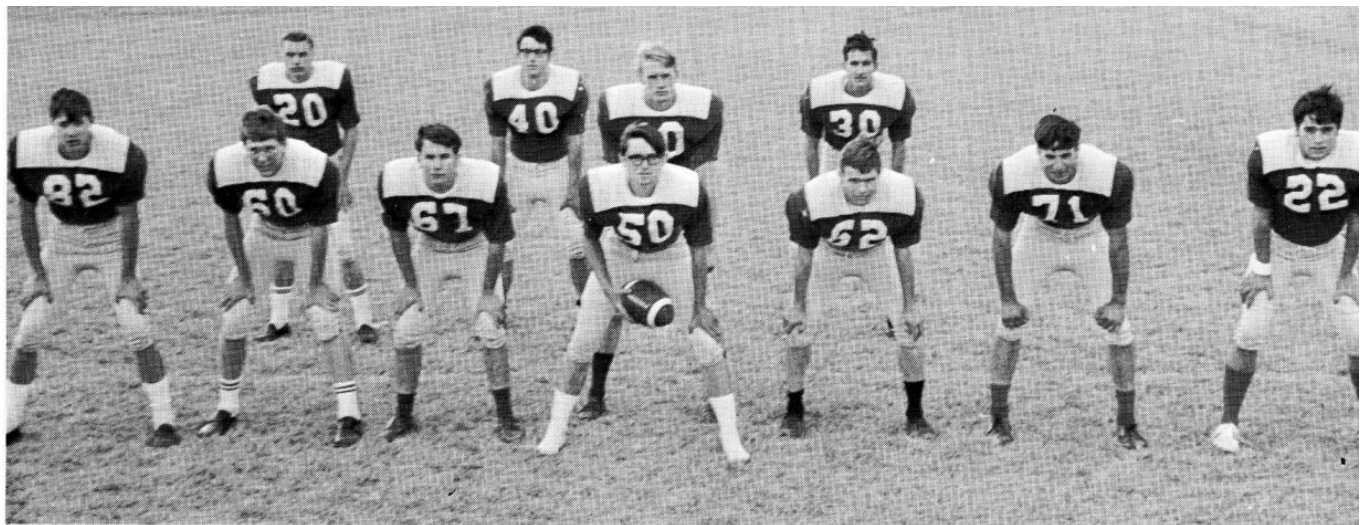
We are happy to report that Susie, after lying unconscious in a hospital for several weeks, has regained consciousness and should recover completely from the accident.

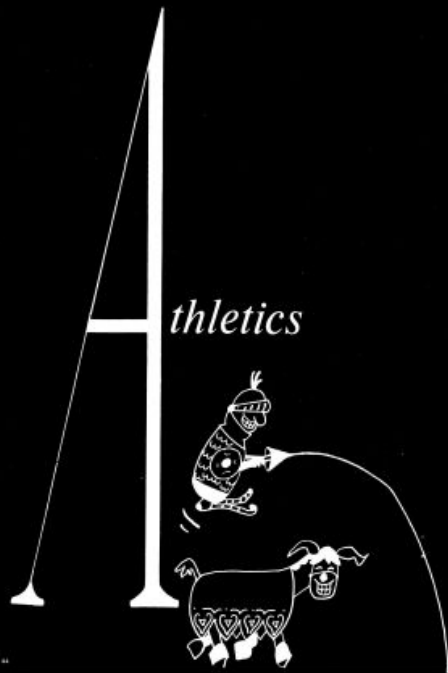

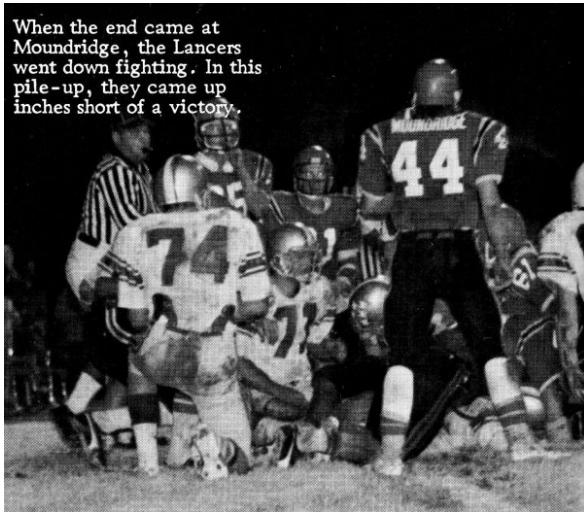
